## Golf's potential phased approach linked to the Welsh Governments

### 'Unlocking our society and economy: continuing the conversation' publication

The Welsh Government has recently published the above document, where they provide a 'traffic light' guide to their thinking about how we move out of the current lockdown.

COVID-19 is spread by social interaction and the effects of meeting other people. Where two people from different households meet and both otherwise live and work on their own, then the risk is low. As numbers of contacts grow, so do the risks of creating chains of transmission and outbreaks.

Every step in the table below depends on making the right decisions.

The 'red' 'amber' and 'green' labels represent broad phases to illustrate how the Government can begin lifting lockdown measures. The table below shows how these measures COULD look for Golf, to be used alongside the current Government, Industry, Wales Golf, and Club guidelines to ensure maximum safety.

Doing more in the 'red' phase, or moving beyond it, is dependent on continued progress in containing the spread of the virus, as well as monitoring how Golf adheres to the guidelines.

The Government could move more quickly in some areas than others as the evidence changes, and they understand more about the risks and how they can be managed in different settings. Similarly, they may need to reverse course in some areas should conditions worsen.

Highlighted in **yellow** is the current stage Wales is within the traffic light system.

#### Seeing family and friends

#### Getting around

**Green** Unrestricted travel subject to ongoing precautions.

#### **Exercise, playing sport and games**

**Lockdown** Exercise once a day outside of house on own or with household.

**Red** **Exercise more than once a day and incidental activity locally.**  
Outdoor sports courts to open. Elite athletes resume some activity.

**Amber** Team and individual sports, non-contact sport and games in small groups indoors and outdoors. Some outdoor events with limited capacity and events behind closed doors for broadcast.

**Green** All sports, leisure, and cultural activities open, with physical distancing. All events resume with limited capacity.

#### **Relaxing and special occasions**

**Lockdown** Stay at home and only leave the house for essential purposes.

**Red** **Some opening of outdoor cultural and other sites.** Relaxation and leisure outdoors where local.

**Amber** More cultural and leisure sites to reopen (e.g., museums and galleries). Weddings and other events with limited capacity and physical distancing.

**Green** All special occasions and cultural and leisure activities permitted with precautions in place.

#### **Working or running a business**

**Lockdown** Work from home, if possible. List of businesses required to close.  
2m requirement in workplaces where not possible to work from home.

**Red** **More outdoor work and click-and-collect retail.** Businesses not required to close (e.g., construction) reopening under safe-working practices.

**Amber** Non-essential retail to reopen with physical distancing. Trial some personal services under appointment (e.g., hairdressers). Accommodation businesses open without shared facilities.

**Green** Restaurants, pubs, and customer contact industries under physical distancing. All businesses and workplaces open under new protocols.

### Going shopping/ retail

- Lockdown** Essential retail only face-to-face.
- Red** **Include click-and-collect for non-essential retail.** Begin making adaptations to the public realm (e.g., town centres).
- Amber** Can access most non-essential retail where adaptations are possible to maintain physical distancing.
- Green** Town centres and high streets adapted to facilitate shopping and accessing services under physical distancing. Able to access all retail and leisure facilities whilst taking reasonable precautions.

### Education and Care for Children

- Lockdown** Closed except to key workers and vulnerable children. Outreach services in place.
- Red** **No change, but able to manage an increase in demand from children already eligible to attend schools and childcare.**
- Amber** Priority groups of pupils to return to school in a phased approach. Increased numbers of children in childcare.
- Green** All children and students able to access education. All children are able to access childcare.

Below is Wales Golf's interpretation of what Golf COULD look through the various stages in the traffic light system. It is for information (and potential planning) purposes only. Insight feeding this strategy is updated continuously, and we could move backward, remain static, or forward at different stages and within various categories.

Adhering to Government guidelines is **paramount**. Clubs must ensure equal and fair access to all sections at all times through the stages and should make reasonable adjustments (where current legislation allows) for those with a disability. Clubs should consider implementing a strategy for those experiencing financial hardship as a result of COVID-19. Speak to the Development Team for more advice on this.

Each change MUST to be risk assessed to ensure maximum safety and suitability for each club.

**The shaded burgundy**

- the current phase Golf is at within the Government guidelines.
