## Come on Seren!

Seren's ability for golf was remarkable. It was obvious to everyone that she was going to live up to her name – Seren was going to be a STAR.

She kept going for lessons and practiced very hard. Taid helped with her attitude on the golf course. He taught her to accept bad shots and keep positive even when things were not going well. "If you get mad with yourself and start sulking then your game will probably just get worse." he said.



He reminded Seren that golf is unusual in that players rarely have referees like in football and rugby. Players must be totally honest about keeping their scores and applying the many rules strictly to themselves, as well as others. He also encouraged her to look as smart as possible on the course — "Look good and play well!" was his motto.

Seren kept all her golf clothes neat and tidy and mixed them up in different combinations. She usually wore smart shorts, a neat top and a hat.

She had three tops she particularly liked, three pairs of shorts and three hats. The tops were red, yellow and blue – so were the shorts and hats.

\*REMEMBER when you start golf, like Seren, you can often borrow clubs or buy great value second-hand clubs. Many Golf Clubs offer free taster sessions for beginners of all ages.

## Keeping score

Seren continued to improve rapidly. She played with Taid and other very good golfers and she practiced a lot.

She kept a diary of all her scores in all the tournaments that she played in. You can see some of her notes below. The amount of shots it should usually take a good player to complete a hole is called a "Par". If a player scores one shot under Par on a hole it is called a "Birdie". If a player scores two shots under Par on a hole it is called an "Eagle". If a player scores one shot over Par it is called a "Bogey". Two over Par is a "Double-Bogey". Any holes worse than this Seren recorded as "Others". Taid had reminded Seren to be fair and accurate with every shot she played and recorded.

Golf is a game where the player is responsible for an honest record of their game.

Here are Some of Seren's notes for ten rounds. Each round is 18 holes so she played 180 holes.








## The Curtis Cup comes to Conwy!






