Announcements

All teams will first be announced on the Wales Golf website and social media accounts, at 14:00 on date stated above. Selected players will then receive a formal letter, via email, to confirm their selection and arrangements.

In the majority of cases, reserve players will not be announced publicly.

Automatic Selections

Automatic selections are awarded to the number of players stated for each event, based on their position in the **World Amateur Golf Rankings (WAGR) on the Announcement Date** stated for each event. These automatic selections are subject to players being **ranked 1000 or better for Women's teams**, and **ranked 2000 or better for Girls' teams**.

If an automatically selected players is ineligible or unavailable to be selected for a team, the Selection Committee will select an alternate player. The next best ranked player in WAGR will not be automatically selected.

Supporting Notes

- All selections are subject to a player not being under any kind of review for code of conduct or disciplinary issues either by their Club, County or Wales Golf.
- All persons selected for Welsh teams /competitions, must to the satisfaction of the Director of Pathway & High Performance and Selection Committee, as follows:
 - Meet the Welsh eligibility criteria (see below)
 - Comply and have complied with the **etiquette of golf** as laid down by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews
 - Follow and have followed any guidelines published by Wales Golf relating to conduct and guidance for Welsh Golf Teams
 - Comply with anti-doping rules laid down by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), which can be found here https://www.ukad.org.uk/2021Code . If players are taking any medication they must check the prohibited list and apply for Therapeutic Use Exemption if required.
- Communication regarding your availability to be considered for selection, or if you
 are unavailable to be considered for selection is welcomed, via email to the Chair
 of High Performance (Carl Rowe v.rowe@sky.com).
- While individual player statistics are not considered during the selection process, it is
 highly recommended that players maintain their stats as this information can be
 helpful to enable performance staff to support a player, should they be selected. Wales
 Golf encourages all players to maintain statistics and can offer a limited number of online
 stats packages on a first come first served basis. If you would like to avail of a stats

2. Eligibility for International Selection

You are eligible to play for Wales if you meet one of the following criteria:

- Born in Wales
- One of your parents was born in Wales
- One of your grandparents was born in Wales

- Resided in Wales for three years prior to the start of the Welsh Amateur Championship in the year of selection (if over 18 years of age)
- Previously represented Wales at Junior or Senior level in Home International Matches or European Team Championships or World Amateur Team Championships (players will be asked to provide evidence of this)

You are not eligible to play for Wales if:

- You have played in the Close Championship of another country within the last two years (e.g. to be eligible to play for Wales in 2024 you must not have played in the Close Championship of another country in 2023 or 2022) or:
- You have played in the full International Team of another country

With the following exception for U18's:

Any boy or girl under 18 years who has competed in the Closed Boys' or Girls'
Championship of any other country or played in the Boys' or Girls' International Team
of any other country.

3. Key Events

Important Notes

- Results and scoring data will be collated from each of these Key Events. This data, along
 with observations by members of selection committee at identified events (*), will be
 presented to the selection committee for consideration in advance of the selection
 meeting.
- Consideration for selection will also include participation and performances in national championships outside GB&I.
- While results and scoring data from other events may be considered at the discretion of the selection committee, it is recommended that you prioritise competing in these Key Events in order to enhance your position to be considered for selection.
- Members of the selection committee, including national/squad coaches, are not permitted to advise players on their schedule after 31st March 2024, as this may be construed as offering an advantage to some players over others.
- It is accepted that players will not be in a position to compete in all of these events and expected that players do not endeavour to do so. Therefore, we recommend that you refer to the "Tournament Schedule Guidance" and discuss with your personal performance team, when determining a tournament schedule that fits with your goals and personal circumstances.
- Please note that these Key Events are only relevant to the selection of teams stated in this
 document. Players are encouraged to continue to compete in events after these selection
 dates, as all performances will be considered when selecting teams for any challenge
 matches or training squads later in the year.

4. Selection Process

Selection Factors

Members of the selection committee will consider the following objective and subjective information when determining team selections ...

- Performances in KEY EVENTS, as outlined in this document, including ...
 - Stroke average (and stroke differential)
 - o Finish position, relative to strength of the competing field
- Current World Amateur Golf Ranking, including ...
 - o relative movements within a 6 month period
 - events in which ranking points have been accumulated
- Historical performances in relevant events, including ...
 - Stroke play or match play record, relevant to the format of event for which a team is being selected
- Ability to adapt to the demands of the competition environment, including ...
 - o Competition format (i.e. matchplay, strokeplay, singles, foursomes)
 - Course typography and difficulty (i.e. length, accuracy, grass type, green size & speed etc.)
 - Physical fitness required to perform in the competition environment
- Attitude and willingness to be a team player and contribute to the goals of the team

The above guidance for Selection Committees is only relevant to those teams Note: listed. All nominations for other representative teams, as well as the allocation of individual exemptions or invites to international events, will be at the complete discretion of Wales Golf.

Non-Selection

While Wales Golf is supportive of a clear, transparent and fair selection process, there can often be no clear distinction between players in all of the objective performance factors (typically for the final 50% of places on a team). Therefore the role of the selection committee is to make a judgement decision based on objective and subjective performance factors, and to ultimately select players that it deems to be most suitable for a given team or event and that is in the best interests of Welsh golf.

If a player is not selected, they are encouraged to review the selection factors listed above, consider these with their personal coaching team and work towards improvements in these areas.

Selection Process Enforcement

The processes of the selection committee, relevant to the selection of teams listed in this document only, are applied by the Director of Pathway & High Performance. These processes are subject to annual review and amendment.

Appeal Process

If an individual is not satisfied that the selection process was implemented appropriately, and wishes to formally appeal a selection, this must be done so based on one of the following grounds

- The decision was based on error of fact
- The decision was manifestly unreasonable given the facts before the committee
- Serious irregularity occurred in the selection process

The individual seeking to appeal the selection committee's decision must serve a "Notice of Appeal", in writing, to the Wales Golf Chief Executive within 3 days of the team announcement. This Notice of Appeal shall state the following information:

- Date and decision against which the appeal is lodged
- The grounds of appeal relied upon
- A statement of facts upon which the appeal is based

Upon receipt of the Notice of Appeal, the Wales Golf Chief Executive will consider the matter and decide if the Notice of Appeal shows that grounds are made for appeal.

It is <u>not permitted</u> to approach a member of the selection committee with regard to upcoming selections or to request information/feedback on recent or historical selections. Selection is implemented under strict confidentiality and therefore any approach to a member of the selection committee is unacceptable, as the integrity of the selection process is paramount.

5. Other Event Nominations

The above guidance applies to **TEAM EVENTS listed in section 1 ONLY**. All nominations for other representative teams and individual competition exemptions will be <u>at the complete discretion of Wales Golf</u>. These nomination events are not to be considered as a representative honour for Wales, but are opportunities for players to compete at international level. Typically players are nominated based on their commitment to the Wales Golf High Performance Squad programme or on their potential for future development.

The number of events and invitations available will fluctuate annually and a formal process is not applied for these nominations.

Examples of these events may include, but are not limited to ...

- Challenge Matches
 - o Quadrangular Match

- o Challenge Matches (Various)
- Invites to individual events
 - o European Women's Amateur
